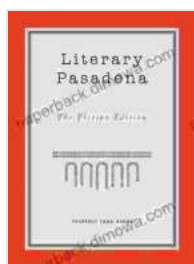

Map of Pasadena's Literary Landmarks

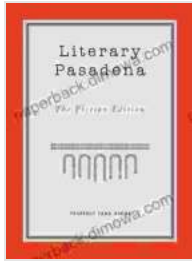


This map shows the locations of Pasadena's many literary landmarks. You can use this map to plan your own literary pilgrimage.

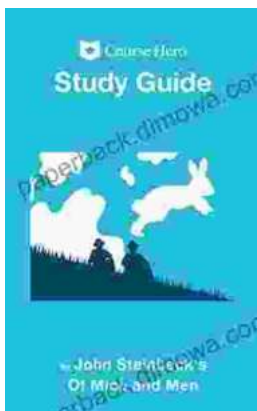
