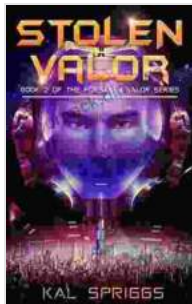


Stolen Valor Forsaken Valor: Exposing the Fake Heroes of Our Time

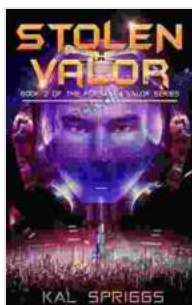

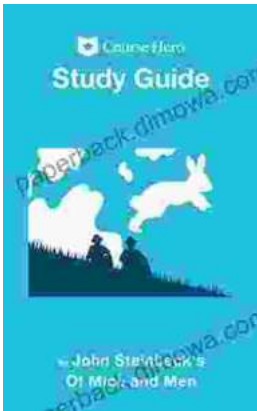
