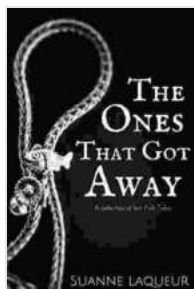

The Lord Lucan Case

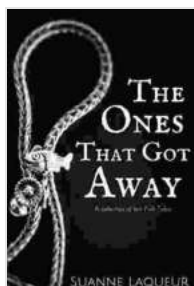

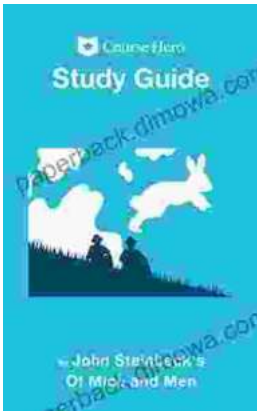
